Results of Consultation on Regenerating the Pentrefoelas Area

1. Background

- 1.1 An application was submitted to the UKSPF Conwy Community Regeneration Key Fund at the end of September 2024 to carry out a feasibility study in the Pentrefoelas area regarding the regeneration of the area, and it was confirmed that that application had been successful on 21.12.2023.
- 1.2 Amgen Consultants Limited had submitted a quotation for relevant work before the application went in, and the company was appointed to assist with the feasibility study.
- 1.3 Gwion Jones from Amgen Consultants Limited attended meetings of the Pentrefoelas Community Council in January, February and March 2024 to discuss the work, make relevant plans, and develop the necessary documents for consultation regarding the regeneration of the Pentrefoelas area.
- 1.4 The purpose of the consultation was to get the opinion of people who live in the Pentrefoelas area, work there, or use facilities in the area about what the priorities should be in terms of regenerating the area.
- 1.5 A questionnaire was developed for this consultation between January and March 2024 with input from Pentrefoelas Community Council and the Elected Member for the area. The final version included ideas for regeneration projects that had come from relevant organisations and associations, as well as some that came from the Community Council.
- 1.6 Welsh, English and bilingual versions of the questionnaire were produced, with the hard copies distributed being mainly bilingually.
- 1.7 The consultation period began on 07.03.2024 and a time limit was given of Friday 26.04.2024 for the return of completed questionnaires. The Community Council was willing to receive questionnaires after that date as well, especially from members of organisations or associations that would not have met before then.
- 1.8 Questionnaires were distributed in hard copy and via e-mail by Pentrefoelas Community Council Members, Gwennol Ellis the Elected Member for the area, and through Pentrefoelas School. The intention was to ensure that every household in the parish of Pentrefoelas received a copy of the questionnaire, and door to door calls were made to try to ensure that. Some blank questionnaires were also left in the Bocs Bwyd, where respondents were asked to leave completed questionnaires.









2. The Respondents

- 2.1 A total of 47 completed questionnaires were received containing responses from 53 people. Three questionnaires gave the names of 2 people in the relevant box and one questionnaire gave the names of a family of 4. In the cases where more than one person had contributed to the questionnaire, the number of contributors was given for the purpose of counting the number of responses of different types in this report.
- 2.2 The respondent's name was requested as part of the questionnaire to try to guard against the possibility of people filling in more than one questionnaire. As can be seen in table 1, only 4 completed questionnaires did not include a name.

- 2.3 As might be expected, the majority (60%) of the respondents gave Pentrefoelas as their village, town or area, with 13% giving Rhydlydan, which is in the parish of Pentrefoelas.
- 2.4 There were a total of 12 people who gave another place, and one respondent who did not give an answer to this question. Of those who did not give Pentrefoelas or Rhydlydan as their village, town or area, it seems that the majority of them; if not all; are people who work in the area or use facilities there.

2.5 In terms of age ranges, 34% who gave their age range put between 25 and 49, and 42% put between 50 and 67. The total number of responses from those under 25 was lower than what might have been expected.

2.6 In terms of language choice, a significant majority of the responses were in Welsh (87%), but there were also quite a few in English (21%). The totals include responses from 4 of the contributors made both in Welsh and in English and the percentages therefore come to more than 100%.

3. Answers to the questions

3.1 Strengths of the Pentrefoelas area at the moment

This was an open question and there was a wide range of different answers to it. Every response gave at least one strength, many gave three or four, and the most given was seven.

Similar answers were given under the same heading for the purpose of analysis, and the answers given by three or more respondents are included in table 5.

It was the School and the local community that respondents identified as the area's greatest strengths at the moment, with both getting around twice as many people mentioning them as any of the other answers.

3.2 What most needs attention

This was also an open question, and once again similar answers were given under the same heading for the purpose of analysis. The answers given by three or more respondents are included in table 6.



There was very strong support among the respondents for a), c) and d) with between 70% and 79% giving them a high priority, between 13% and 23% giving them a medium priority, between 6% and 8% giving them a low priority and no one saying they were not needed.

There was also good support for b), e) f), and g), with between 37% and 49% giving them a high priority and between 28% and 46% giving them a medium priority. Of these four, e) and f) had the most support with everyone who responded in support of f), and only 3 saying that e) was not needed. The support was slightly less for g) with less giving it a high or a medium priority and 4 saying it was not needed.

It was b); the dedicated running track around the school field; for which there was least support from the ideas included in the table. However, 36 respondents (68%) gave the idea a high or medium priority, and only 8 (15%) said it was not needed.

A total of 38 respondents (72%) had included at least one idea in their response to this question, with a number having included more than one.

As can be seen in table 8, there were a large number of different ideas and some of them reflect things given in response to question 2, what most needs attention in the area at the moment. Others reflect desires for additional facilities or to retain what is currently available.

While all the respondents gave a priority level for the ideas included on the questionnaire in response to question 3, a significant number did not do so for the ideas that they had added themselves.

3.5 The importance of trying to regenerate the Pentrefoelas area
